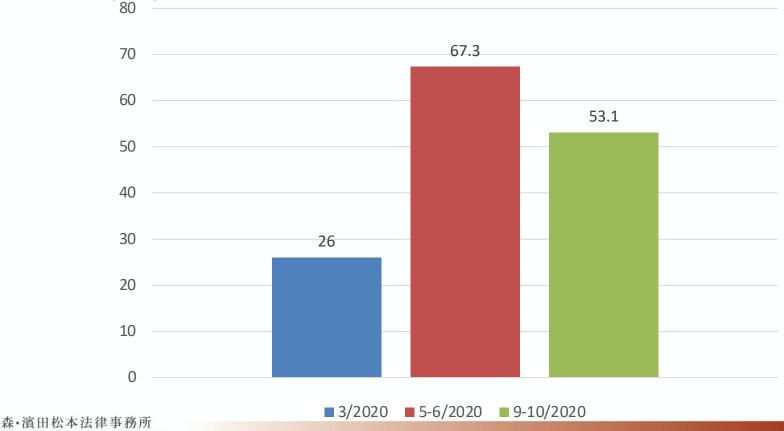

- Paperless
 - ✓ File storage
- Facilities (PC, network connection)

- ➤ Grants to Support the Promotion of Workplace Reform (by Government) (働き方改革推進支援助成金)
- ➤ Subsidized projects such as the establishment of satellite offices (by Tokyo Metropolitan Government) (サテライトオフィス設置等補助事業)
